Daily Phone call check in - Ontario Law Organizations - March 19, 2020 Summary

Issues discussed:

1. Bail Hearings

Efforts are currently underway to move these entirely online. OBA will coordinate with SolGen and MAG and courts to create online virtual courtrooms.

2. Family Matters

Lawyers and clients are urged to NOT appear at courthouses for non-urgent matters! A new updated notice is being prepared. To view what constitutes an urgent matter, people are directed to [this notice](#). Lawyers are also asked to avoid filing for non-urgent matters.

3. Compliance Issues - LSO

There are many concerns right now - mostly regarding real estate. For now, if an Affidavit cannot be witnessed, lawyers are STRONGLY encouraged to ensure their client is available via phone when the matter is discussed before the courts. They will be required to be affirmed over the phone (however, no decision has been finalized yet on this). This is a challenge because judges cannot be "ordered" what to do in their courts.

4. Limited Period & Rules Around Filings

MAG is working on solutions for litigants with deadlines.
