SUPERIOR COURT OF JUSTICE UPDATES

On August 2nd, the SCJ announced that the <u>Notice to the Profession, Parties, Public and the Media</u> has been amended to clarify parties' responsibilities in civil and family matters regarding (1) filing books of authorities and facta, (2) providing accurate hearing-time estimates, and (3) bringing to the attention of the court all relevant material facts and the authorities that establish the legal proposition relied upon (as it is not sufficient to merely upload filed materials to CaseLines). MINISTRY OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL & SOLICITOR GENERAL (ONTARIO) * eINTAKE

The Ontario government has expanded the use of the eIntake digital platform to include the Eastern region, making the platform available right across the province. eIntake expedites the process for law enforcement officers to file criminal charges electronically and streamlines the information shared between police, other enforcement agencies and courts in real time. It also allows Justices of the Peace to enter their decisions, sign documents digitally and request additional information from law enforcement officers online. The eIntake system is now being used by 64 enforcement agencies and 129 courthouses across Ontario. It is among a series of digital initiatives the Ontario government is taking to build a justice system that is seamless, simple and efficient. See announcement <u>here</u>.

Following a month of consultations, Theresa Leitch, LiRN's Managing Director, presented a revised Library Services & Management Responsibilities Policy HR Policy and Guidelines document to the Board on July 18th. FOLA has received an embargoed copy of the new, revised Draft and are in the process of reviewing it. At first glance, the changes are very positive. FOLA is NOT allowed, at this time, to share the document. However, we expect copies to be sent to Association Presidents next week.
