LIBRARY SERVICES & MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITIES POLICY HR POLICY AND GUIDELINES

Following a month of consultations, Theresa Leitch, LiRN's Managing Director, presented a revised Library Services & Management Responsibilities Policy HR Policy and Guidelines document to the Board on July 18th. FOLA has received and reviewed an embargoed copy of the new, revised Draft. At first glance, the changes are very positive. FOLA is NOT allowed, at this time, to share the document. However, we expect copies to be sent to Association Presidents late this week or early next week.
