LSO Approves Recommendations in Response to the FOLA Motion re: Access to Legal Services in Underserved Communities

On November 30, 2023, Convocation approved recommendations from the Access to Justice Committee in response to a FOLA-backed motion carried at the Law Society's May 2023 Annual Meeting.

The committee plans to undertake research concerning the motion including consulting stakeholders and examining what communities are under-served both geographically and in areas of law, prior to bringing recommendations to Convocation for approval.

New OCJ Judge in Fort Frances Fills 11-Year Vacancy

FOLA is pleased to share that a new judge of the Ontario Court of Justice has been appointed in Fort Frances. The Rainy River District Law Association, with the support of FOLA, has been advocating to see this long-standing judicial vacancy filled for more than a decade.

Justice Terry Waltenbury was sworn in on November 16, 2023 and is the only judge based in chambers in the Rainy River District. We thank Attorney General Doug Downey and provincial court Chief Justice Sharon Nicklas for allocating this position to Fort Frances.

Law Society's Certified Specialist Program to Continue

On November 30, a report went to Convocation which made several recommendations in response to the robust feedback from the professions in response to the Certified Specialist Program (CSP) consultation earlier this year.

Convocation approved several recommendations regarding (CSP) as presented in the report including:

- The Law Society will continue to administer the CSP.
- Commencing January 1, 2025, Certified Specialists will be required to complete 10 hours of Continuing Professional Development, in their area of speciality every year, in addition to the 12 hours of CPD required by all licensees providing legal services on an annual basis.



• The Law Society will explore opportunities for the enhancement of the CSP including the recertification process and the potential expansion of the CSP to paralegals and report back to Convocation on their viability.

LiRN – The Key Library Network Processes Project

LiRN recently wrote to the Law Association Presidents announcing a new LiRN project - The Key Library Network Processes Project. The project will focus on bringing courthouse libraries across the province together to work even more seamlessly by examining key library processes. LiRN will be working with a representative from Parallax Information Consulting, who will take a close look at the work the libraries are performing to:

- Discover existing co-operative processes (the network-wide interlibrary loan system is a great example of this working well) and recommend improvements if necessary; and
- Recommend new processes that could be added or centralized for more effective functioning;
- Recommend any support required to implement the recommendations.

Consultations are scheduled to begin in November and the representative from Parallax Information Consulting will meet with the following groups to get their thoughts on the key processes common to courthouse libraries across the network:

Ministry of the Attorney General: Vexatious Litigant Procedural Framework

The Ministry of the Attorney General recently sought input and perspective on a potential amendment to the *Courts of Justice Act* regarding the procedure to seek a "vexatious litigant" order. MAG sought input on the following questions:

- 1. Is your organization concerned about vexatious litigants/vexatious litigation in the Ontario civil justice system?
- 2. With respect to the current framework for dealing with parties who engage in vexatious litigation (including the provisions in the *Court of Justice Act*, the Rules, and case law), what are the downsides?
- a. What are the strengths?
- 3. Are there specific reforms to this framework that you would propose?
- 4. In contemplating possible reforms to this framework, what safeguards do you consider important to protect the right of Ontarians to access the civil courts to resolve their disputes?

Federation of Law Societies of Canada: National Requirement Review

The Federation of Law Societies of Canada (FLSC) is conducting a review of the National Requirement, which is the standard that law graduates from Canada and abroad must meet to qualify for entry to bar admission programs in the common law provinces and territories.

The FLSC's National Requirement Review Committee sought feedback on options and preliminary proposals for amendments to the National Requirement described in the Discussion Paper that is available on the FLSC website, <u>here</u>.

King's Counsel Designation

FOLA was recently contacted by the Attorney General of Ontario's office requesting input on a new public process for the selection of King's Counsel, and specifically with respect to criteria and process. A consultation document was not provided.

Due to a very tight deadline for response, FOLA was unable to consult widely with our members. FOLA's responsive submission can be found <u>here</u>. Recognizing that there are a diversity of views on this topic, we encouraged the Attorney General's Office to consult broadly across the legal community.

Amendments to Family Law Rules

The Ministry of the Attorney General has issued a Notice to the Profession regarding amendments to the Family Law Rules. The Notice to the Profession can be found <u>here</u>.

Justice Services Online Enhancements

The Ministry of the Attorney General recently announced that they would be releasing changes to its Justice Services Online (JSO) platform effective October 30,2023. The following enhancements will be deployed:

- The current ONe-*key* platform is being decommissioned and replaced by '*My Ontario Account*', which is a Government of Ontario login service that will eventually allow a user to sign in quickly and securely to all Government of Ontario services using one common set of login credentials.
- JSO currently uses the ONe-*key* platform and must transition over to the 'My Ontario Account' service.



- Going forward, users who wish to access JSO services will be guided to create a *My Ontario Account*. Users will have the option to migrate their existing JSO account in order to retain any transaction history and confirmation of documents previously submitted to the court through JSO.
- Interac Online will no longer be an available payment method as the vendor who supports Interac
 payment is ceasing support across several platforms. Payment of any court filing fees can still be
 processed through other payment methods, including Visa, Visa Debit, Mastercard, and Debit
 Mastercard.

A User Guide has been developed which may be of assistance to members. The guide will walk the user on how to create a My Ontario Account, migrate their existing JSO profile if they wish or create a new profile.
