2023 BUDGET CONSULTATIONS

The Ontario Government is currently seeking submissions/comment in advance of their 2023 Budget. FOLA will be making a written submission. ONTARIO'S STANDING COMMITTEE ON JUSTICE POLICY

On Monday, in advance of Ontario's Standing Committee on Justice Policy hearings on Bail Reform, FOLA sent our Submission for their consideration. In it, we reminded the Committee that an effective bail system is one which respects the presumption of innocence and the Charter right to reasonable bail and that Ontario's courts are subject to binding appellate jurisprudence on the considerations made during a bail hearing. FEDERAL GOVERNMENT FUNDING - COMMUNITY SERVICES RECOVERY FUND

ONTARIO REVIEW BOARD (LAWYER MEMBER): The Ontario Review Board (ORB) seeks candidates who are interested in being appointed as a part-time Legal member. The Ontario Review Board is an independent adjudicative tribunal created by the Criminal Code of Canada that determines levels of risk and makes decisions and dispositions for persons found not criminally responsible on account of mental disorder, or unfit to stand trial, in accordance with Part XX.1 of the Criminal Code. The board is committed to carrying out its mandate to adjudicate hearings under Part XX.1 of the Criminal Code in an independent, transparent and accountable manner, consistent with its statutory mandate. **Deadline is February 5th.** Learn more & apply via our Job Board here.

CONSENT AND CAPACITY BOARD (LAWYER MEMBER): The Consent and Capacity Board (CCB) seeks candidates who are interested in being appointed as a part-time Lawyer Member. The CCB is an independent adjudicative tribunal created under the Health Care Consent Act. The board receives its adjudicative authority from the Health Care Consent Act, the Mental Health Act, the Substitute Decisions Act, the Personal Health Information Protection Act, the Child and Family Services Act and the Mandatory Blood Testing Act. The CCB's mandate is to adjudicate on matters of capacity, consent, civil committal, substitute decision-making and other issues affecting citizens of Ontario, the health care community and other government agencies. The CCB is responsible for holding hearings and making decisions in accordance with the legislation and relevant case law. **Deadline is February 5th. Learn more & apply via our Job Board here.**
