JUSTICE CANADA

REMINDER - FAMILY LAW: The Department of Justice Canada invites all Family Lawyers to participate in the <u>2022 National Family Law Survey (NFL Survey</u>), which will take approximately 15 to 20 minutes to complete. This year, the focus is on child support. **The deadline is December 23**rd.

Background Information about the NFL Survey:

Since 1998, the Department of Justice Canada has conducted biennial surveys of lawyers' and judges' experiences in family law in Canada, collecting data geared toward family law policy development. Historically the NFL Survey was administered only to participants at the National Family Law Program Conference. Starting in 2018, however, it has been distributed to Law Societies across Canada through the Federation of Law Societies of Canada (FLSC) to increase participation in the Survey. Since 2019, the NFL Survey has been distributed to family law legal advisers across the country through the FLSC and the Canadian Bar Association – Family Law Section.

The NFL Survey collects information on the characteristics of practitioners' family law cases, and their experience in family law issues. This information assists in the development of policy and programs related to family law in Canada. If you are a family law legal advisor, please fill out the <u>Survey for Lawyers</u>.

MINISTRY OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

COURT FEE INCREASES: Pursuant to regulation, court fees in civil, small claims and family matters in the Superior Court of Justice and Court of Appeal automatically increase every three years by applying the Consumer Price Index, beginning January 1, 2023. To ensure continued access to justice,

fee waiver eligibility thresholds are increased at the same rate. A complete list of the fee and fee waiver eligibility threshold increases can be found here. Building Justice: Frank Iacobucci and the Life Cycles of Law

September 2022 | 9781487566289 | 376 pp | 9 b&w illustrations | Hardcover & eBook \$36.95 Building Justice draws on the inspiring life of former Canadian Supreme Court Justice Frank Iacobucci to offer insight into the meaning of engaged citizenship through law. Ignoring early advice that he had the wrong kind of name to go to law school, Frank Iacobucci, the son of Italian immigrants, made a name for himself as an outstanding Canadian jurist. Serving as justice of the Supreme Court of Canada from 1991 to 2004, Iacobucci was also professor and dean of law at the University of Toronto and deputy minister of justice for Canada.

In *Building Justice*, Shauna Van Praagh weaves together the voices of individuals whose paths and projects have intersected with those of Frank Iacobucci. The book provides a compelling consideration of the study and practice of law as it follows the stages of Iacobucci's life and career: from his childhood in Vancouver, his practice as a young lawyer, his time at the University of Toronto and with the Federal Department of Justice, his work as a judge at the highest level of court, and his significant engagement with Canada's ongoing response to the legacy of residential

schools. *Building Justice* is a beautifully written biography in which the stories of one jurist serve to explore and illustrate engaged citizenship through law.

LAW SOCIETY OF ONTARIO

- ❖ FAMILY LEGAL SERVICES PROVIDER LICENCE (FLSP): Convocation approved the creation of an FLSP licence. Paralegals who complete the specified training will be able to assist clients with process navigation, completing applications for joint and uncontested divorce and motions to change for child support, based on the payor's "line 150/T4 slip" income and excluding special and extraordinary expenses. The proposed scope also includes responding to support proceedings and court appearances on motions to change, subject to the limitations described previously. The full details can be found in the report. The Access to Justice Committee will review the FLSP licence within three years of its implementation to determine its impact on access to justice and report to Convocation. Following the vote, FOLA issues this Statement.
- ❖ REMINDER BENCHER ELECTIONS: Nominations are now open for the 2023 Bencher Elections! You can find more information on FOLA's Bencher Elections webpage. Information as to how FOLA will be involved in these elections will be discussed at our Fall 2022 Plenary and will be posted on that page following the event. Also, over the coming weeks, FOLA will be adding resources for those considering running so please do visit this page regularly! Nominations are open until February 24th and voting will occur online in April 2023 with the results announced on May 1, 2023 after the tabulation of votes.
- ❖ REMINDER CONSULTATION: EXPANDED REMEDIAL OUTCOMES FOR THE PROCEEDINGS AUTHORIZATION COMMITTEE (PAC): The Professional Regulation Committee is seeking feedback on its recommendation to expand the remedial outcomes available to the Proceedings Authorization Committee (PAC) to include mandatory regulatory meetings and continuing education or remediation programs. Visit <u>LSO Website</u> for more information. Deadline is January 15, 2023.
- ❖ AWARDS PART 1: The Human Rights Award recognizes outstanding contributions to the advancement of human rights and/or the promotion of the rule of law provincially, nationally or internationally. The award is granted for devotion to the advancement of human rights and the rule of law over a long term or for a single outstanding act of service. The call for nominations deadline is December 31. Learn more on the LSO website.
- AWARDS PART 2: Nominations for the 2023 Law Society Awards are open until December 16, 2022. Award criteria, the nomination process and the online nomination form are all available here. Paralegals are eligible for the William J. Simpson Distinguished Paralegal Award. Awards for lawyers include the Law Society Medal and the Laura Legge Award. Both lawyers and paralegals are eligible for the J. Shirley Denison Award and the Lincoln Alexander Award. Nominations are encouraged for members from all communities, practice areas, firm sizes and regions across the province.
