FOLA's WEEKLY UPDATE December 21, 2022

SUPERIOR COURT OF JUSTICE UPDATES <u>REMINDERS:</u>

VIRTUAL TRIAL SITTINGS FOR CIVIL, NON-JURY CASES: The SCJ Regional Senior Judges Council ("RSJ Council") is commencing an initiative to address the backlog of civil trials that developed as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. In order to provide timely access to justice in civil cases, RSJ Council has resolved to schedule two, four-week long virtual trial sittings for civil, non-jury cases. Judicial resources from across the province will be pooled to provide pre-trial and trial dates.

The first sitting will target cases in Southwest Region. Cases will be selected based on age and likelihood of being scheduled for trial within a reasonable amount of time. During the second sitting, cases from all regions will be considered for inclusion based on the same criteria. <u>Key points:</u>

- Two, four-week long trial sittings will be held on the following dates: November 14, 2023 to December 8, 2023 April 1, 2024 to April 26, 2024
- Civil, non-jury trials will be scheduled
- Both pre-trial conferences and trials will be held virtually
- Use of CaseLines will be mandatory In the coming weeks, parties will begin receiving pre-trial and trial dates. In cases selected, counsel and witnesses must make themselves available.

JUSTICE CANADA

REMINDER - FAMILY LAW: The Department of Justice Canada invites all Family Lawyers to participate in the <u>2022 National Family Law Survey (NFL Survey</u>), which will take approximately 15 to 20 minutes to complete. This year, the focus is on child support. **The deadline is December 23**rd.

Background Information about the NFL Survey:

Since 1998, the Department of Justice Canada has conducted biennial surveys of lawyers' and judges' experiences in family law in Canada, collecting data geared toward family law policy development. Historically the NFL Survey was administered only to participants at the National Family Law Program Conference. Starting in 2018, however, it has been distributed to Law Societies across Canada through the Federation of Law Societies of Canada (FLSC) to increase participation in the Survey. Since 2019, the NFL Survey has been distributed to family law legal advisers across the country through the FLSC and the Canadian Bar Association – Family Law Section.

The NFL Survey collects information on the characteristics of practitioners' family law cases, and their experience in family law issues. This information assists in the development of policy and programs related to family law in Canada.

MINISTRY OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

COURT FEE INCREASES: Pursuant to regulation, court fees in civil, small claims and family matters in the Superior Court of Justice and Court of Appeal automatically increase every three years by applying the Consumer Price Index, beginning January 1, 2023. To ensure continued access to justice, fee waiver eligibility thresholds are increased at the same rate. LIRN

LiRN is once again extending the deadline for fund balance proposals and there will be an information session on January 11th. Associations will an invitation to that session in the new year. **New deadline for submitting you business case is Jan 25, 2023**.

Association's business cases will be presented to LiRN's Audit and Finance Committee and Board meetings, currently scheduled in February. Associations will be notified of the results of the Board meeting as soon as practicable thereafter.

As a reminder, the business cases should include:

- The initiative
- The cost of the initiative
- The amount of the excess fund balance required
- How the initiative aligns with LiRN's mandate and supports and improves the library network
- How the initiative relates to library expenses that the LiRN grant covers, including:
 - o Library staff salaries
 - o Collection expenses
 - o Expenses related to the operation of the library
 - o Some capital expenses related to the library. Examples include library furniture, bookshelves, computers, printers, and copiers. Note that some equipment such as photocopiers may be more cost effectively procured centrally and identifying the equipment need is a necessary first step.
